We are happy to report that the Best Supportive Care study has enrolled 100% of its participants (40 enrolled out of N=40), and all 4 study sites are in the data collection phase! Many thanks to the research staff who have asked insightful questions, been enthusiastic and dedicated in recruiting clinicians and patients, and have shown the utmost professionalism in conducting the research. We appreciate you!

QDACT.PCRC Feasibility

Principal Investigator: Arif Kamal MD

All 5 study sites conducting the QDACT feasibility testing protocol are actively collecting and entering QDACT.PCRC data and completing the feasibility questionnaire in the electronic data capture system. To date, over 267 of the targeted 600 encounters have been entered. In the next month, a subset of 10 clinicians will be randomly selected to participate in a mid-study phone interview. Thanks to all of the study site team members for their efforts in building and maintaining relationships with the palliative care clinicians at your site — we couldn't do this without you!



NINR Updates

There is a new Administrative Supplement available from the National Library of Medicine, in conjunction with NIH Institutes and Centers: PA-15-249. Investigators who hold an active RO1 from the institutes listed on the funding opportunity application are eligible to apply.

"These administrative supplements provide funds to active awards of participating Institutes and Centers in order to enhance the storage, organization, management and use of electronic research data through the involvement of informationists, also known as in-context information specialists."

New NINR policies that will be in place for future proposals:

NIH/AHRW Policy for Application Submission

The purpose of this Notice is to remind applicants that the basic requirements for allowable applications have not changed with the updated NIH/AHRQ policy on application submission (see NOT-OD-14-074 and NOT-OD-14-082). Investigators now may submit a new application, following an unsuccessful application, without concern for scientific overlap with previously reviewed applications.
