UPDATE: Manuscripts and Dissemination

Good news: the manuscript describing the main results of the Statin Trial has been submitted for publication! **Better news**: two PCRC manuscripts have been accepted for publication to the Journal of Pain and Symptom Management (JPSM)! The first describes recruitment strategies for studies enrolling participants with life-limiting illness, and the second depicts the process of working with IRBs on PCEOL studies. **Great news**: the PCRC will be presenting abstracts about the safety of discontinuing statins at the upcoming European Association for Palliative Care (EAPC) and American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) meetings.

Announcement from the Scientific Review Committee

If you have a research idea that you would like to submit to the Scientific Review Committee (SRC), please fill out a Letter of Intent (LOI), which is available on the website under the Studies tab. A completed LOI, which replaces the original Study Concept Template, will help the SRC understand your research idea and provide relevant details for the SRC to determine whether the study goals of the proposed project align with the goals and priorities of the PCRC and would benefit from PCRC infrastructure.

Requesting a Letter of Support (LOS) from the PCRC

If you are submitting a grant and would like to request a LOS from the PCRC, the following process has been developed to demonstrate collaboration between the investigator and the PCRC: LOI is first reviewed for alignment and understanding and then used to prepare a proposed budget and subcontract, culminating in both a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the investigator and PCRC, and a signed LOS.
